Christopher is an active 12 year old boy who is creative and is often engaged in some sort of make-believe-play. Adoption makes Chris nervous, but he's coming around to the idea. He is currently residing in a group home and doing well there, so he needs a family that can support that placement for the time being and understand the importance of relationship and trust building prior to him moving into a new home. Because Chris is very focused on his environment and keeping himself safe, having control over his environment and knowing what is coming next are important to him.

Chris needs a flexible family who is willing to give him some control over things while still holding him accountable, as well as advocating for him in the school setting and being available to help with school work when needed. Additionally, Christopher maintains regular Skype contact with his sister as well as in-person visits throughout the year, so he will need a family that will continue to encourage this relationship.

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Child Welfare Advocates Call for Changes to address "re-homing"

The United States Senate Subcommittee on Children and Families met on July 18 to discuss how adopted children who are being passed from family to family in a practice called "re-homing." Experts testified that solutions included requiring court supervision for a transfer of child custody to a nonrelative and restricting online solicitation of new parents for children. Testimony included addressing the need of improved post adoption family resources for parents who are struggling with raising an adopted child.
