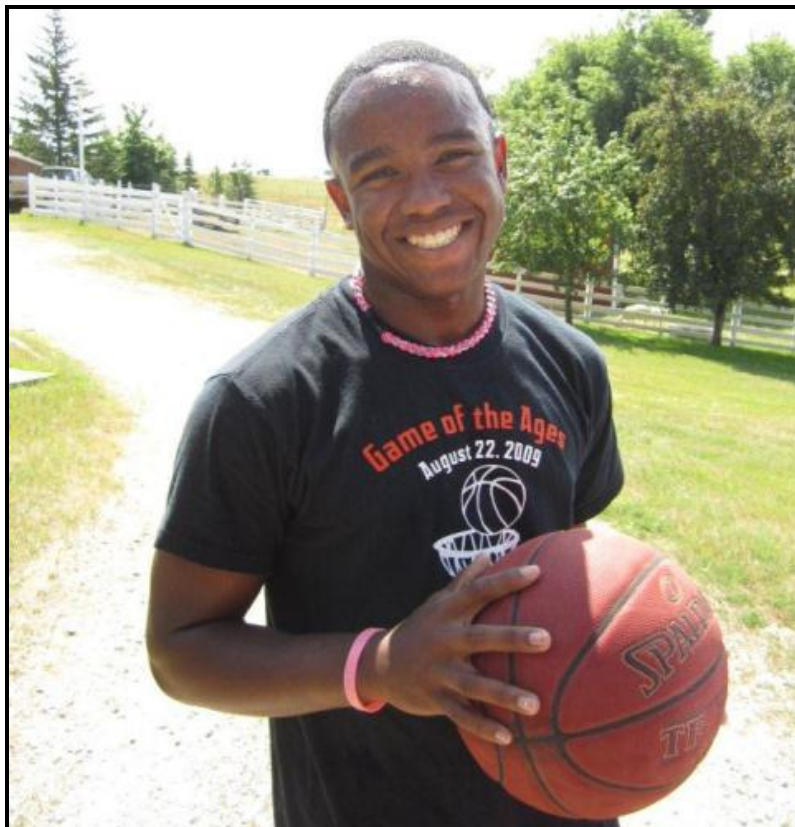

Who is Donovan?

Donovan (15) is a smart, talented, athletic young man. He can be very talkative, though is sometimes shy or cautious with new people. He likes to read and play video games. He sings in honors choirs, and has written some articles for his local newspaper. His favorite subject in school is gym, though he also likes social studies, and he generally does well keeping his grades up (so he can stay on his extracurricular sports teams). He's interested in college, and hopes to get a sports scholarship. Donovan is GREAT at football and basketball, and is highly motivated and dedicated to his athleticism. He can be a bit competitive, but he gets along well with his coach, and is good at taking advice or constructive criticism and immediately applying it to better his performance. Donovan's foster family report he has been a pleasant addition to their household, and describe him as an "ordinary teen."

A Family for Donovan

Donovan grew up in northwest MN, and would prefer to stay in the area, but is open to searching further. Donovan has no preference for family race. Donovan would like a family with some kind of faith, though isn't comfortable with Islam. Donovan doesn't mind if he has a single parent or two parents, but isn't sure he's ready for same sex parents. He thinks an older brother would be cool, and does not want a younger sibling. When asked if Donovan would like to be adopted, his response is usually a shrug. Donovan has experienced a lot of loss and not much acceptance, and has responded by



becoming a polite, compliant, and distant young man who does not share his inner thoughts or feelings or reach out for connections. Instead, he focuses on the things he can control and manage, which has been his exceptional athleticism. His forever family will need to understand that Donovan will be a friendly, pleasant young man in the home, but it will take a long time before he recognizes he can be more than a polite and quiet guest in a family's home, and can become a loved and loving son.

Child Psychological Abuse as Harmful as Physical or Sexual Abuse:

A study by the American Psychological Association shows that children who suffer from psychological abuse have the same or higher risk of suffering from depression, anxiety, attachment issues, substance abuse, and other mental health concerns.
